Executive Summary

Aquaculture is the farming of aquatic organisms including fish, molluscs, crustaceans and aquatic plants. Farming implies some form of intervention in the rearing process so as to enhance production such as regular stocking, feeding and protection from predators. Aquaculture contributes to poverty alleviation as it provides nutritional food and employment to millions of people, both in the sector itself as well as in support services.
